**CONSULTANCY SERVICES FOR
A RESETTLEMENT SPECIALIST**

1. The Millennium Challenge Corporation (“MCC”) and the Government of Tanzania (the “Government”) have entered into a Millennium Challenge Compact (the Compact”) for Millennium Challenge Account assistance to help facilitate poverty reduction through economic growth in Tanzania in the amount of Six Hundred Ninety-Eight million, one hundred thirty-six thousand USD (“MCC funding”). The Millennium Challenge Account-Tanzania (“MCA-Tanzania”) on behalf of the Government intends to apply a portion of the proceeds of MCC funding to eligible payments under this contract. Payments by MCA- Tanzania will be subject, in all respects, to the terms and conditions, including restrictions on the use of MCC funding of the Compact. No party other than the Government and MCA-Tanzania shall derive any rights from the Compact or have any claim to the proceeds of MCC funding.
2. The five-year Compact aims at reducing poverty through the implementation of a program consisting of three projects, each containing a number of activities and sub activities namely:
 1. **The Transport sector Project** consists of four distinct activities, the Mainland Trunk Roads Activity, the Zanzibar Rural Roads Activity, the Road Maintenance Activity and the Mafia Island Airport Activity.
 2. **The Energy Sector Project** consists of three distinct activities, the Zanzibar Interconnector Activity, the Malagarasi Hydropower and Kigoma Distribution Activity, and the Distribution Systems Rehabilitation and Extension Activity.
 3. **The Water Sector Project** consists of three distinct activities, the Lower Ruvu Plant Expansion Activity, the Non-Revenue Water Activity, and the Morogoro Water Supply Activity
3. The Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) will provide funding for activities under the Compact subject to each project conforming to the Government of

Tanzania regulations and the MCC's Environmental Guidelines and Gender Policy as well as comply with the World Bank Operational Policy 4.12 on Involuntary Resettlement (OP4.12). The completion and implementation of an appropriately scaled resettlement action plan (RAP) is a condition precedent to disbursement prior to the commencement of construction. In this regard MCA-Tanzania (MCA-T) intends to contract an Individual Consultant to provide technical support and assistance on a part-time basis to the Director, Environmental and Social Impact.

4. Expected outputs of this assignment are Reviews of RAPs, training of staff and trip reports.
5. The consultant will provide technical support and expertise in the review of Resettlement Action Plans, training of staff and related RAP issues as required. The anticipated duration of the assignment will be approximately 12 months, on a part-time basis. **Full details of the requirement, including the definition of “part-time” are contained within the Terms of Reference, which can be provided upon email request, to the addresses at 10 below.**
6. This Invitation for Proposals follows the General Procurement Notice that appeared 3 April, 2009 on dgMarket's website, 8 April, 2009 on the UNDBOnline website, 3 April, 2009 on the MCA-Tanzania website www.mca-t.go.tz and in local newspapers, The Daily News and The Guardian from 6 April 2009.
7. MCA- Tanzania now invites **Individual Consultants** (not firms) to provide their CVs and a covering letter expressing their interest in providing these Consulting Services and their proposed methodology. This is open to all eligible Individual Consultants who wish to respond.
8. A Consultant will be selected under the Individual Consultant procedures, the evaluation procedure for which is in accordance with “MCC Program Procurement Guidelines” which are provided on the MCC website www.mcc.gov.
9. The minimum qualifications for the Consultant are:
 - Must have a post-graduate degree in social sciences, planning or a related field;
 - At least 10 years of work experience in resettlement with sound knowledge of World Bank Operation Policy 4.12;
 - Previous professional experience with MCC, World Bank or other similar international donors, planning for and/or implementing resettlement activities is desirable;
 - Effective cross-cultural communication with fluency in English;
 - Experience working in Tanzania or East Africa is preferred;
